Through the prayers of our holy Fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us. Amen.

The KONTAKIA are sung here as prescribed. And then...

Lord, have mercy. (X12)

All-holy Trinity, Might one in essence, Kingdom undivided, Origin of all good things, be graciously inclined also unto me a sinner. Establish Thou me; give understanding to my heart, and purge away all my vileness. Enlighten my mind, that I may glorify, sing praises, and adore Thee, and say: Thou only art holy, Thou only art the Lord, O Jesus Christ, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

THE RECEPTION OF HOLY WATER

Everyone who is about to receive should pray this together.

O Lord my God, may thy gift of holy water be for the remission of my sins, for the enlightenment of my mind, for the strengthening and health of the faculties of my soul and body, and for the uprooting of my passions and infirmities, in accordance with

thy boundless mercy, through the prayers of thy most pure Mother and of all thy saints. Amen.

Partake of holy water, thanking God for His gifts and grace.

Blessèd be the name of the Lord, henceforth and forevermore. (x3)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

PSALM 33

I will bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth.

My soul makes its boast in the Lord; let the afflicted hear and be glad.

O magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt His name together!

I sought the Lord, and He answered me, and delivered me from all my fears.

Look to Him, and be radiant; so your faces shall never be ashamed.

This poor man cried, and the Lord heard him, and saved him out of all his troubles.

The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear Him, and delivers them.

O taste and see that the Lord is good! Blessèd is the man who takes refuge in Him!

END NOTES

It is a pious practice in some monasteries that do not have a priest to treat the partaking of Holy Water at Typika as if they were receiving the Eucharist. In other words, they fast, complete their pre-communion prayer rule, and chant the post-communion prayers afterward. The extent that each person wants to follow such a fasting and prayer rule is between them and the Lord, but I think it is a good and beneficial practice.
